Medical Horaries

One of the most common issues that clients present to the astrologer working in the medical field is the medical question. This is the realm of the Medical Horary. It is one of several techniques that can be employed by the astrologer to gain insight into the situation of the "patient", the nature of the complaint and possible actions and outcomes.

A medical horary is not a decumbiture, even though the rules for reading both of these charts are similar. A medical horary chart takes the time a *question* is posed; a decumbiture is the time of a medical *event*.

The horary, decumbiture and natal charts may all be used in a case as well as other techniques such as assessment of the patient's temperament and general predictive work.

This lecture will look specifically at the range of medical questions that may cross the practitioners' desk. These cover the area of the classic "What is wrong with me", "Is it serious", "Am I well or am I sick" to other common questions around issues like pregnancy and third party questions about the health of friends and family.

The reading of the medical chart will be revised along with example charts and the ethical background of working in the medical area and managing questions on death and length of life.
